Dead to Sin, Alive to God

Romans 6:1-2 (NKJV) ¹ What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? ² Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?

If God loves to forgive, why not give him more to forgive? If forgiveness is guaranteed - - - -, do we have the freedom to sin as much as we want? Paul's forceful answer is By no means! Such an attitude – deciding ahead of time to take advantage of God's grace shows that a person does not understand the ______ of sin.

Romans 6:7 (NKJV) For he who has died has been freed from sin.

Our "old self", our sinful nature, died once and for all, so we are freed from its power. As a believer, you are not to live by the old nature. You have a new nature, and you are to yield yourself or present yourself to God.

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV) Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

??? Now, if the Bible were to say that a believer can not be completely _____ by sin, would that help answer the following question: Can a Christian be involved with lifedominating sin???

Romans 6:14 For sin shall not have dominion over you, for you are not under law but under grace. So, can a Christian be ______ entangled in life-dominating sin? Don't think so, according to God's Word. - - - Will you struggle against your flesh? Absolutely. But, are some Christians just destined to remain in bondage to a problem area or two that seem to be reoccurring more often that they should? Absolutely not! We must fight against our flesh, pray for God's strength, and willfully choose not to succumb to that temptation, until we get the victory.

Now let's look at the question: does God hold us responsible for all our deeds, including thoughts, words, and actions? The world's view is that man's _______ is often caused by genetic predisposition and are perceived as addictions, diseases, or mental illnesses. Also, the environment that we were raised in, or a dysfunctional childhood will often give an individual freedom from _______ for their actions. To an extent I agree with the world's perspective. The Bible does teach that every person on this planet is genetically predisposed to sin according to: Romans 5:12 (NKJV) Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned -- Sin has been in our DNA for thousands of years. I also agree that all people come from a dysfunctional family. The Adams Family! God's View: Our works will be ______ by the motives behind them.

2 Corinthians 5:10 (KJV) For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things *done* in *his* body, according to that he hath done, whether *it be* good or bad.

Our hope: No matter how serious or longstanding our sin, it can be ______ and in a very short period of time, as we follow God's plan for our life.

1 John 5:3-5 (NIV) ³ In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, ⁴ for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. ⁵ Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

Results of not being honest with God and staying enslaved to sin:

- 1. God may not hear or answer our prayers.Proverbs 28:9Psalm 66:18
- 2. You will bear spiritual and physical consequences.
- 3. You may lose your joy and assurance of salvation.
- 4. You place yourself under the corrective discipline of the Lord. Hebrews 12:5-11

 1 Corinthians 15:33 (NKJV) Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits." Psalm 139:23-24 (NKJV) ²³ Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me, and know my anxieties; ²⁴ And see if *there is any* wicked way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting.
- 3. Take ______ steps to eliminate, resist, or flee from temptations. Proverbs 27:12 (NIV) The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and pay the penalty.

Galatians 5:22-24 (NKJV)

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.
 ²⁴ And those *who are* Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8 (NKJV)

Do not give this project to someone who will not be absolutely and completely honest with you.

Keep both copies, and pray through them weekly, seeking the Holy Spirit's power to overcome the presence of these flaws in your life. This task will prove itself invaluable at the end of the course.



CHARACTER FLAWS TO CONQUER

Circle any potential character flaws that apply to you

- **Abusive** Characterized by improper infliction of physical or psychological maltreatment towards another.
- Addict (Professing) Unrestrained compulsive activity. Gambling, alcohol, drugs, sex, shopping, internet, video games, etc.
- **Aimless / Apathetic** Indifferent, lack of enthusiasm, devoid of direction or purpose, showing little emotion, expressionless, spiritless, lack of concern.
- Angry Irritation and aggravation with others leads to internal/external hostility.
- Anxious Constantly in distress or uneasiness because of fear of danger or misfortune; greatly worried; nervous, jumpy, annoyed.
- Arrogant / Rude / Snobbish Having or displaying a sense of overbearing selfworth or self-importance. Others are inferior.
- **Bigot** One who is strongly partial to one's own group, religion, race, or politics and is intolerant of those who differ.
- Blunt (Overly) insensitive, callous, brash, brassy, gruff, stern, hard.
- Callous / Cold Hardened to emotions, rarely showing any form of emotions in expression, unfeeling.
- Childish Marked by or indicating a lack of maturity.
- **Co-Dependent / People Pleaser** Validating self-worth through appeasing others, even at the expense of truth, enabler.
- **Complainer / Grumbler** Prone to faultfinding, judgmental, sin sniffing, lacking grace.
- **Disloyal** Lacking loyalty. Unfaithful in commitments, not valuing others time. Your yes is not yes. Fickle.
- **Egotistical** Having an inflated idea of their own importance. Boastful, pompous, selfish.
- **Envious** Greed of another's acquirements in life, painfully desirous of another's advantages, covetous, jealous.
- Gluttonous Given to excess in consumption especially of food and/or drink.
- **Gossip** Prone to unrestrained conversations with unconfirmed details. Spreading rumors, stories, slander to harm another's reputation.



- **Gullible** Believes any information given, regardless of how valid or truthful it is, easily deceived or duped, naïve, lacking discernment and critical thinking skills.
- **Hedonistic** Pursuit of worldly pleasures or senses. Lust for worldly things/stuff.
- Humorless The inability to find humor in things, especially in themselves.
- Hypocritical One whose behavior contradicts their own beliefs.
- **Ignorant** (Willfully) Intentional lack of desire to pursue knowledge, information, wisdom or intellectual growth.
- **Impatient** Unable to wait patiently or tolerate delay; restless. Unable to endure irritation or opposition; intolerant.
- Indecisive Characterized by lack of decision and firmness, especially under pressure.
- Intolerant Unwilling to tolerate difference of opinion and narrow-minded about self-cherished opinions.
- Immature Emotionally undeveloped; juvenile; childish.
- Judgmental Inclined to make and form judgments, especially moral or personal ones, based on ones own opinions or impressions towards others, i.e.: practices/groups/religions based on appearance, reputation, occupation, etc.
- Lazy Resistant to work, exertion, spiritual growth. Disposed to idleness.
- Liar Compulsively and purposefully tells false truths, regardless of motivation.
- **Meddlesome** Given to meddling; interfering, taking on other's offenses.
- **Miser** Prone to greed, stinginess, ungenerous.
- **Naive** Lacking worldly experience and understanding, simple and guileless; showing or characterized by a lack of sophistication and critical judgment.
- Nosy Given to prying into the affairs of others; snoopy. Offensively curious or inquisitive.
- Obsessive An unhealthy and compulsive preoccupation with something or someone.
- **Overprotective** Coddler, enabler, overly spoil, pamper, overly indulgent.
- **Paranoid** Extreme and irrational fear or distrust of others.
- **Peevish** Unjustifiable dissatisfaction. Cantankerous, cross, ill tempered, testy, captious, discontented, crotchety, cranky, ornery, disagreeable.
- **Pessimist** A tendency to stress the negative or unfavorable or to take the gloomiest possible view.
- **Proud** Filled with or showing excessive self -esteem, and will often shirk help from others for the sake of pride.



- **Rebellious** Defying or resisting some established authority, government, or tradition; insubordinate; inclined to rebel.
- **Reckless** Heedless. Headstrong. Foolhardy. Unthinking boldness, wild carelessness and disregard for consequences.
- **Remorseless** Without remorse; merciless; pitiless; relentless.
- **Sarcastic** A subtle form of intentional mockery to inflict injury.
- Selfish Concerned chiefly or only with oneself.
- **Self-Martyr** One who purposely makes a great show of suffering in order to arouse sympathy from others, as a form of manipulation.
- **Self-righteous** Piously sure of one's own righteousness. Moralistic. Exhibiting pious self-assurance. Holier-than-thou, sanctimonious.
- Shallow Lacking depth of intellect or knowledge; concerned only with what is obvious.
- **Smug** Haughtily confident of one's ability, superiority, or correctness.
- **Spineless** Lacking courage. Cowardly, wimpish, gutless.
- **Spiteful** Showing malicious ill will and a desire to hurt; motivated by spite; vindictive person who will look for occasions for resentment. Vengeful.
- **Spoiled** Treated with excessive indulgence and pampering from earliest childhood, and has no notion of hard work, self-care or money management; coddled, pampered.
- **Stubborn** Unreasonably unyielding; bullheaded, stiff-necked.
- Tactless Lacking or showing a lack of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others.
- **Temperamental** Moody, irritable, or hyper-sensitive, volatile, emotionally led.
- **Theatrical** Having a flair for over dramatizing situations, inflating the severity, drama queen/king. Every challenge in life is "code-red".
- **Troublemaker** Someone who deliberately, intentionally, stirs up trouble.
- Untrustworthy Not worthy of trust or belief. Unfaithful with given tasks.
- **User** A person who uses something or someone selfishly or unethically.
- **Vain** Holding or characterized by an unduly high opinion of their physical appearance. Lovers of themselves. Conceited, egotistic, narcissistic.
- Withdrawn Unfriendly, unsociable, aloof.
